Community Service Requirements

Sixth-grade -- at least 10 hours of service

Maximum of 5 hours in the home

Minimum of 5 hours outside the home

Service outside the home includes service done in church, community, Saint Louis School or any nonprofit.

Seventh-grade -- at least 10 hours of service

Service includes service done in church, community, Saint Louis School or any nonprofit.

Eighth-grade -- at least 15 hours of service

Service includes service done in church, community, Saint Louis School or any nonprofit.

Service is verified by completing the middle school community service verification form available online

Failure to complete community service will affect promotion to the next grade

Ninth-grade -- 20 hours of service

Minimum of 5 hours of SHED

15 hours of regular community service for any non-profit organizations.

Service must be done outside of the home and school.

SHED hours are direct service performed for those that are Sick, Homeless, Elderly or

Disadvantage. Certain environmental project can be considered SHED

Tenth-grade -- 20 hours of service

Minimum of 10 hours of SHED

10 hours of regular community service for any non-profit organizations.

Service must be done outside of the home and school.

Eleventh-grade – 20 hours of service

Minimum of 15 hours of SHED

5 hours of regular community service for any non-profit organizations.
