Community

Six miles east of the financial and civic center of Honolulu, Saint Louis School commands a panorama of Waikīkī and the Pacific from the Kalaepōhaku ridge of the Koʻolau mountains. Within walking distance of the University of Hawaiʻi at Mānoa and the East-West Center, the campus adjoins another Marianist facility, Chaminade University of Honolulu. Astride major bus routes that link to a metropolitan population of over 905,000, Saint Louis serves students residing throughout Oʻahu.

School

Saint Louis School is a private, Catholic Marianist school for young men, grades six through twelve, offering a college preparatory education. The school continues a 165-year tradition of serving students of diverse religions, cultural traditions, and socio-economic backgrounds. Having an annual operating budget of \$10.8 million, Saint Louis School also provides financial assistance to approximately 37% of its students.

For the 2010-2011 school year, the ethnic breakdown of the student body is as follows: Asian or Pacific Islander (Non-Hawaiian), 42%; Part-Hawaiian, 39%; Caucasian, 17%; Multi-Ethnic, 1%; Hispanic, 1%; African American and other, 1%. The total enrollment of 604 students was comprised of 156 in the middle and lower schools (grades 6–8) and 448 in the high school.

The five Characteristics of Marianist Education provide the fundamental guidelines for 55 faculty and counselors. Classroom enrollment averages an optimal 20 students per teacher. Three full-time academic counselors and one full-time college counselor—including one member of the Society of Mary, or the Marianists—serve all students. The student-to-counselor ratio is approximately 201 to 1.

Situated on Kalaepōhaku since 1927, the campus features a new state-of-the-art facility, the Clarence T.C. Ching Learning and Technology Center, housing fine arts, technology, archives, and business leadership programs as well as a conference center. Future plans include the renovation of the original campus structures and construction of an expanded athletics and events center. The 2011-12 school year marks the launching of 1:1 laptop computer integration in all grade levels as well as installation for wireless accessibility in all campus buildings.
