^B \$50 maximum contribution per primary accountholder. Business accounts are not eligible to participate.

^C To be eligible to participate, schools must offer services/courses to at least one of the following student groups: K through 12.

^D The school with the highest number of designations at the end of the promotion receives \$100,000. If there are multiple schools with the highest number of designations at the end of the promotion, that is, a tie, then American Savings Bank will choose from among those schools one school by random drawing to receive the \$100,000.
