Deadline: With Application

Criteria: WUE is the Western Undergraduate Exchange, a program coordinated by the Western Interstate Commission for High Education (WICHE). Through WUE, students in western states (Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming) may enroll in many two-year and four-year public college programs at a reduced tuition level: 150% of the institution's regular resident tuition. In all cases, WUE tuition is considerably less than nonresident tuition. Note: **Residents of Hawaii may now enroll as WUE students in four-year programs and community colleges.** Virtually all-undergraduate fields are available to WUE students at one or more of the participating colleges and universities. Some institutions have opened their entire curriculum on a space-available or first-come, first-serve basis; others offer only designated programs. **Eligibility:** Many institutions require evidence of academic performance, such as ACT/SAT test scores or a specific high school GPA, or place other conditions on WUE enrollment.
